

Collocations 1

Introduction

This worksheet pracitces using a variety of common collocations in simple sentences.

Before the Lesson

Print (A4 size) the two page worksheet as many times as you need for the amount of students you have.

In the Lesson

Provide each student with a copy of the two-page worksheet.

In exercise 1, students match the verb with an appropriate counterpart to create a collocation. There could be more than one collocation for each verb, so if students create ones that aren't in the answer key, write a list on the board for all to see (bonus collocations) and see if they know the meaning of them.

In exercise 2, students complete the sentences with collocations from the box.

Students circle the correct word to make the right collocation in exercise 3.

For exercise 4, students read a short text and circle the right verb to make the correct collocation.

In exercise 5, students match collocations that have the same meaning. Take this as an opportunity to expand on the exercise and write on the board other collocations the students might know and if those have the same meaning as other collocations.
