

## Sentence Ordering: Dialogues

### Introduction

This simple activity has students put various dialogues into the correct order.

### Before the Lesson

Print (A4 size), laminate and cut out the dialogue strips. In lieu of laminating, print on thicker A4 cardstock paper. Be sure to print enough copies for the amount of students you have, *for example, if you have 15 students in class, print the pdf five times and group students into threes.*

### In the Lesson

Provide each group of students with a set of dialogues. They should work together to correctly order the sentences for each dialogue. There are five in total. Explain any new words.

When they are finished, have them come up with two or three short dialogues with a partner, then take turns reading them to the class.

Mary: Perfect! See you later.

Tom: Bye!

Customer: Hello. I need some milk and bread, please.

Shop Assistant: Sure. Here's the milk. We have white and brown bread. Which one do you prefer?

Customer: Brown bread, please.

Shop Assistant: Okay. Anything else?

Customer: No, that's all. How much is it?

Shop Assistant: That's €5.

Customer: Thank you.

Rachel: Nice weather today, isn't it?

Luke: Yes, it's lovely. Sunny and warm.

Rachel: Perfect for a walk in the park.

Luke: Absolutely! Are you going for a walk?

Rachel: Yes, I think I will. Do you want to come with me?

Luke: I would love to!
