

Adverbs of Frequency

Introduction

This worksheet helps students practice using adverbs of frequency in present simple sentences.

In the Lesson

Provide each student with a copy of the two-page worksheet. Be sure to explain any new words your students might encounter.

In exercise 1, students first sort the adverbs to the correct percentage usage. Then they complete the sentences using their own ideas. They may need additional help to do so.

In exercise 2, students answer the questions about themselves. After completing exercise 2, they complete exercise by adding four more questions they could ask someone about how often they do something, then work with a partner to ask and answer each other their questions. They will need to be able to tell the class five things about their partner, so make a point of it to go around and check their sentences before they speak.

For exercise 4, the students need to correct the sentences and put the adverbs in the correct position in the sentence.

 30% - sometimes
 5% - rarely

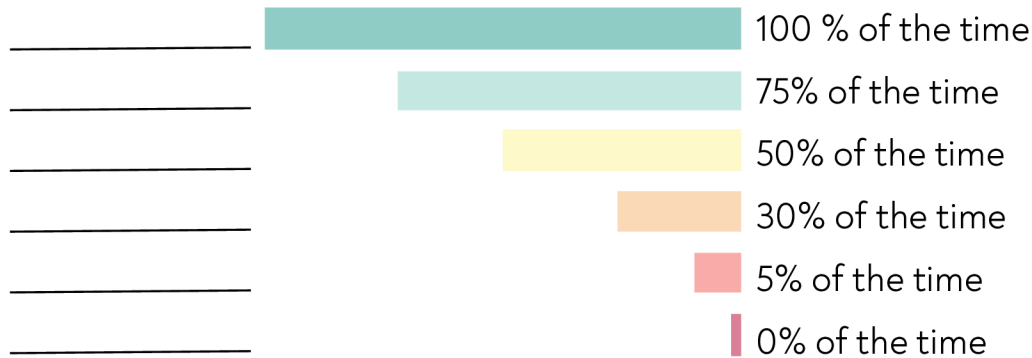
'ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY'
